- Zoom Social Hour on Friday afternoons to provide the space needed for mutual support.

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Readying the Ship: Summer, 2020

- Reactive → **Proactive**
- Pedagogical questions + Technological solutions = 3 Summer Sessions
- Motivations:

 - Training for the incoming SCI instructors
- Instructional technology workshops offered in addition to the training sessions.

Looking ahead

What we learned from experience

- **Guest Talks**
 - In-person when possible
 - Always available online
 - Sharing with partner institutions
- **Instructional Technology Workshops**
 - In-person (with a tutorial-esque recording available online)
 - Develop a tangible deliverable.
 - Fewer topics but more thoroughly covered
- **Pedagogy Workshops**
 - The colloquium formula
 - We still need to implement it in-person.
 - Focus on the deliverables.

What we learned from our instructors

- **More Sharing and Connecting!**
 - In person
 - Between instructors (professionally and personally)
 - Between language programs (internally and externally)
 - With other institutions
- **Workshops**
 - Support for empirical research (financial and statistical)
 - Assessments
 - Publishing
 - Analog → Digital
- **General**
 - TL-agnostic event of interest to everyone
 - Strong preference for in-person events
 - Much of what was developed during the pandemic is still in use.
 - Developing interdisciplinary relationships
